## SafeSpace to hold annual 'Every Woman is My Sister' event

STUART — SafeSpace will be holding their 6th annual Every Woman is My Sister event, their signature fundraiser, on March 21 starting at 6 p.m. at Willoughby Golf Club in Stuart. This year's honored guests will be keynote speaker Denise Brown, as well as honorary chairs and former NFL players Rich Campbell and Charles Emanuel. The event is a celebration of SafeSpace's successes in

helping victims of domestic violence become survivors.

Denise Brown, sister of Nicole Brown Simpson, will share her experiences of domestic violence in one of the most high profile domestic violence cases ever. Twenty years after her sister's murder, she has made it her mission to combat domestic violence and is a National Advocate for the cause. Miss Brown travels the country raising awareness and funds to help organizations combat domestic violence. She has

been a leader in advocating for legislative initiatives on this issue including working for passage of the Violence Against Women Act. She works tirelessly to improve the quality of life for women and children who have been victims.

Former NFL players Rich Campbell and Charles Emanuel will also be speaking on behalf of the many National Football League stars standing up against domestic violence in the midst of recent issues plaguing the League and their families. The scandals surrounding the NFL have brought the often overlooked issue of domestic violence into the spotlight. "We are thrilled to have former NFL players who now live and work in our community stand with us against domestic violence," said Jill Borowicz, CEO of SafeSpace.

Every Woman is My Sister is hosted annually to benefit SafeSpace, a local nonprofit organization and the only Certified Domestic Violence Center on the Treasure Coast. In addition to providing victims of domestic violence with emergency shelter, SafeSpace offers education and support for families through its various outreach programs and its new Supportive Living Program. In the last fiscal year, SafeSpace served nearly 1,100 victims and their children and provided almost 12,000 safe nights of service.

Co-chairs Loretta-DeSantis Fribourg and Robbie Giaccone, along with their event committee members, are hard at work to make this year's Every Woman is My Sister event a huge success. This evening to remember will include cocktails, hors d'oeuvres, dinner and dessert. Tickets are \$150 per person.
