She and her committee members Dot Coblentz, Patricia Imperiale, Barbara McKinnon and Suzi Romanik believe in the cause so much that they have already committed to work on the 15th annual benefit for SafeSpace scheduled for February 18, 2023.

"The community is fortunate that SafeSpace is able to help adult victims and their children, not only with the crisis hotline and emergency shelters but also with many legal, financial and mental health counseling programs and services. We, at Harbour Ridge, want to make sure these SafeSpace programs and services continue as long as they are needed." Tilliss said.

"SafeSpace is truly thankful for the ongoing generous support of the Harbour Ridge community," SafeSpace CEO, Teresa Albizu, said. "Federal and state grants cover only about 50% of agency expenses so we are very grateful that the annual Harbour Ridge benefits have helped us to help thousands of victims and their children in Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River counties."
