

OUR SERVICES

SAFESPACE EMPOWERS THE SAFETY AND WELL-BEING OF ADULT VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND THEIR CHILDREN BY PROVIDING INTERVENTION, PREVENTION AND ADVOCACY SERVICES.

The SafeSpace Crisis Hotline is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to all survivors seeking support services. Professionally trained staff members assess the caller's safety, and provides crisis counseling, support, information, referrals, and a lethality assessment.

SafeSpace provides **Emergency Shelter** for survivors of intimate partner domestic violence and their children from Indian River, Martin, and St. Lucie counties 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Outreach Advocate Services include safety and action planning, lethality assessment, relocation assistance, counseling, legal assistance, referral and linkage to community services, support and educational groups, job assistance, medical and therapeutic assistance, long term housing assistance and other services outside of residential facility.

The Intimate Violence Enhanced Services Team is the partnership of a SafeSpace advocate with local Police Officers to identify victims at high risk for homicide and to intervene in an effort to enhance their possibility of receiving safety from further victimization.

Child Protection Investigations Project aims to keep children out of foster care and in the home of non-offending parents while holding batterers accountable.

Injunction for Protection Program provides legal assistance and representation free of charge in filing injunction against intimate partner and obtaining temporary child support.

Economic Justice Empowerment Program provides advocacy and case management through information and resources to address economic conditions that create barriers to long-term independence and safety of survivors and their children. Assistance is provided with developing personal financial plans, pursuing educational goals, obtaining employment, establishing credit score and banking relationships, and other tactics to become and stay self-sufficient financially.

1 in 3 Women and 1 in 4 Men have experienced Domestic Violence (DV) by an intimate partner. 1 in 15 children are exposed to intimate partner violence each year and that 90% of these children are eyewitnesses to this violence.




